ERASMUS+ PROJECT DEVELOPMENT WORKSHOP

CALL FOR TASKFORCE MEMBERS

In November this year, the Science & Education for Society WG will organise a workshop to develop project proposals for ERASMUS+ KA2 and KA3. In order to plan the workshop, set the priorities, and draft the agenda, we are now looking for interested members to be part of a small taskforce that will be responsible for the organisation. Background

The project development workshop is an excellent opportunity to interact with institutions, civil society organisations, and providers in the field of education and training, to build consortia for the next ERASMUS+ calls. With this workshop we will facilitate finding international partners for the KA2 and KA3 projects and provide a space to develop the proposal.

In short, the project development workshop works in three steps:

Call for project ideas

In this call for ideas, the topic of the workshop is announced. Organisations can apply until August. The taskforce (a selection of members responsible for the organisation of the workshop) will then select the most relevant proposals based on the topic and the degree of innovation. Thereafter, the national ERASMUS agency is consulted and helps identify the ten best project ideas based on objective criteria.

Call for partners

Information on these ten projects is then disseminated to the wider membership and interested organisations can apply to be a partner. Following this, the project leaders screen the applications and select the partners best fitted for their project.

Project development workshop

During the two-day workshop the project leaders meet with the project partners to further develop their proposals and to write the applications. The first day will also involve presentations from the European Commission on the ERASMUS+ programme as well as tips and tricks on how to write a successful proposal.

APRIL

First taskforce meeting

- Overall topic defined
- First practical arrangements
- Prepare timeline and task division

MAY

Call for project ideas

Outlines the process of the workshop and what is required by project leaders.

AUGUST

Deadline for project ideas

The taskforce makes a first preliminary selection based on relevance in relation to the topic and degree of innovation. In collaboration with the ERASMUS national agency a final selection of ten projects are made.

SEPTEMBER

Call for project partners

The ten projects call for partners and any interested organisation can apply. The project leader makes the decision on which partners to include.

OCTOBER

Deadline call for partners

All project leaders now have a consortium for their project proposal.

NOVEMBER

Project development workshop

Including plenary sessions and roundtables for each consortia to work on their proposal.
