

## Boosting circular economy in the transition towards climate neutrality

The Interreg MED Green Growth Community has in the past six years promoted sustainable development and the circular economy in the Euro-Mediterranean region. In its final event, the Green Growth project aims to gather a wide range of stakeholders interested in the circular economy in Brussels - within the frame of the EU Green Week - to showcase its activities in boosting circular economy locally by engaging the entire local ecosystem and supporting the uptake of sustainable practices.

The transition to a circular economy is a prerequisite to achieve the EU's 2050 climate neutrality target, as it will reduce pressure on natural resources while creating sustainable growth and a resource-efficient economy. This transition will require the participation and efforts of all stakeholders – from industry and research to public authorities and civil society, in order to become a reality.

The first part of the event will focus on the changes needed in the ways businesses and public authorities work and operate to create more sustainable societies. Participants will be able to take part of practical examples of how the Green Growth Community has supported the move towards more circular business models and practices in Mediterranean cities and regions. The second part of the event will focus on the importance of cooperation among actors and territories to accelerate the shift towards climate neutrality, especially highlighting the need to involve all stakeholders of the local ecosystem in this transition.

Taking place the day after the EU Green Week conference in Brussels, the event presents a perfect opportunity for participants to combine both events and make the most out of their trip to Brussels. The event will gather stakeholders such as public authorities, researchers and representatives of organisations interested in the circular economy, and will present an excellent opportunity to network and exchange on opportunities around the upcoming Interreg Euro-MED Programme calls for thematic projects. The interactive session will further allow participants to engage in discussions around the role of the circular economy in the transition towards climate neutrality.
